The Dick Williams Band

The Dick Williams Band was put together three years ago by popular Cardiff clarinetist John Evans.

John and Canadian cornetist Dick have been friends for fifty years since their London days playing for notorious gangster Bugsy Falco, tiptoeing their way around the bandstand littered with bottles, glasses, cigars and unconscious gangland flunkies.

Things are different now. John travels up from London to Cafe Jazz for gigs and Dick comes up from the far end of Pembrokeshire bringing pianist and boogie-woogie meister (and professional comedian) Brian Jobson. "He'd be famous if he wasn't so obscure."

John brought in the powerful and inventive trombonist Bob Tunnicliffe from Cardiff and (on loan from Keith Little) whizz drummer Mike Pincombe - and recently, from Gloucester, master double bassist Keith Tolley.

This is a high risk band, so far only meeting in public, often playing difficult, obscure ancient tunes some of them have never even heard! But all have ears and loads of swinging experience.

John and Bob have both toured the UK with star cornetist Wild Bill Davison. Dick is the protégé of the great American trumpeter Max Kaminsky. Dick's previous London band 'Dick's Six' was host band for the USA greats: Billy Butterfield, Yank Lawson, Warren Vaché and Kenny Davern.
